Visceral Lymphatic Drainage/ Chi Nei Tsang



This 30-hour course offers a blend of skills to enhance the function of the vital organs. The course is taught from a Taoist perspective with strong emphasis on energy cultivation, subtle sensing, focused attention, bodywork techniques and botanical adjuncts. Students will learn to tonify visceral function, detoxify vital organs, drain lymphatic pathways, release muscular spasm, enhance qi within the subtle fields and flows and restore mental/ emotional balance within the context of a bodywork session. Students will learn to address a variety of pathologies that may arise from: dietary indiscretion, environmental toxins, pharmaceuticals, vaccinations and mental/emotional distress. The course will be conducted indoors and outdoors and require full in person attendance. Course exercises will include Qigong Exercises, Herbal Preparation, Healing Sounds, Bodywork Exchange and treating the general public within SBBTI's supervised student clinic.
